Questions for consideration:

- Are Darryl Hunt's prosecution and conviction consistent with your beliefs/feelings/expectations regarding the criminal justice system?
- In the future, how do we avoid having similar cases of wrongful conviction?
- In your opinion, who was most responsible for Hunt's wrongful imprisonment? Why?
- To what extent, did race play a factor in Hunt's conviction?
- How does one go about reintegrating with society after decades of incarceration?

- How does this story compare to the story of Darryl Hunt?
- Do we have a moral obligation to ensure that every person currently incarcerated is---to the best of our knowledge---actually guilty of the crime they allegedly committed?
- Should we reexamine older convictions, knowing that many of the stops and convictions were motivated by race and that DNA evidence may exonerate the convicted?
